

**AMENDMENT TO**  
**RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118–10**  
**OFFERED BY MR. SWALWELL OF CALIFORNIA**

At the end of subtitle B of title XVIII, add the following new section:

1 **SEC. 18\_\_ . UPDATES TO COMPREHENSIVE STRATEGY TO**  
2 **PROMOTE INTERNET FREEDOM AND ACCESS**  
3 **TO INFORMATION IN IRAN.**

4 (a) UPDATES TO COMPREHENSIVE STRATEGY.—

5 (1) UPDATES.—Section 414 of the Iran Threat  
6 Reduction and Syria Human Rights Act of 2012 (22  
7 U.S.C. 8754) is amended—

8 (A) by striking “Not later than” and in-  
9 serting “(A) INITIAL STRATEGY.—Not later  
10 than”; and

11 (B) by adding at the end the following new  
12 subsection:

13 “(b) UPDATES.—The Secretary of State, acting  
14 through the head of the Bureau of Cyberspace and Digital  
15 Policy, and in consultation with the Secretary of Treasury,  
16 the Secretary of Commerce, the Administrator of the  
17 United States Agency for International Development, and  
18 the heads of the elements of the intelligence community

1 (as such term is defined in section 3 of the National Secu-  
2 rity Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C. 3003)), shall review the strat-  
3 egy under subsection (a) on an ongoing basis and update  
4 the strategy as appropriate, taking into account the re-  
5 sults of such review.”.

6 (2) SUBMISSION OF FIRST UPDATES.—

7 (A) SUBMISSION.—Not later than 120  
8 days after the date of the enactment, the Sec-  
9 retary of State shall—

10 (i) review and update the strategy  
11 pursuant to section 414(b) of the Iran  
12 Threat Reduction and Syria Human  
13 Rights Act of 2012 (22 U.S.C. 8754), as  
14 amended by paragraph (1); and

15 (ii) submit such updated strategy to  
16 the appropriate congressional committees.

17 (B) FORM.—The strategy under subpara-  
18 graph (A) shall be submitted in unclassified  
19 form, but may include a classified annex.

20 (b) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES  
21 DEFINED.—The term “appropriate congressional commit-  
22 tees” means the following:

23 (1) The Committee on Foreign Affairs, the  
24 Committee on Energy and Commerce, the Com-  
25 mittee on Science, Space, and Technology, and the

1 Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence of the  
2 House of Representatives.

3 (2) The Committee on Foreign Relations, the  
4 Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transpor-  
5 tation, and the Select Committee on Intelligence of  
6 the Senate.
